# SHIP Launches a NEW Mobile Soup Kitchen/Disaster Unit

SHIP is pleased to announce the launching of the new Mobile Soup Kitchen/Disaster Unit, the S.S. Patrick "Joe" Mulrooney with the Blessing of Msgr. Seamus Brennan of the Immaculate Conception Roman Catholic Church in Somerville.



The MSK is part of our ongoing effort to enhance and expand the faith community and the general community's capacity to reduce hunger and homelessness. We provide tangible emergency relief, on an ongoing basis, to high-risk populations in the Somerset County region. Meals are served M - F evening at designated feeding sites. <u>The vehicle was purchased</u> <u>through the efforts of the Montgomery/Rocky Hill Rotary Club</u>. The project to raise the

\$138,000.00 required was spearheaded by Art Martin and Tony Parziale, President of the Club. This effort was responsible for the smooth transition without any interruption of services. The old vehicle expired just as the new one arrived. Without their incredible effort to raise the funds SHIP would have not been able to continue feeding those in need at our feeding sites. Since 1998, SHIP's MSK has served over 450,000 meals.



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#### **Our History**

During the aftermath of the World Trade Center disaster of 9-11, SHIP responded to the call for help from the Emergency Service Units Command Center at Ground Zero. We provided over 10,000 gourmet meals to the uniformed service workers. The Mobile Soup Kitchen -Disaster Unit visited the red zone in Ground Zero every Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday from October 2001 to mid-January 2002. Police and Fire Departments from throughout Somerset County escorted the MSK and support vehicles, carrying volunteers to the site each time we served meals. SHIP raised \$75,000.00 and spent more to cover the cost of operations.



Dear SHIP-mates,

Through the Grace of God and the help of people of good will, we have been able to keep SHIP under sail during these trying times. There are more and more people arriving in their life boats and coming aboard SHIP looking for assistance. The increasing and unending request for emergency food rations has emptied our pantry, refrigerators and freezers. Hundreds more are coming to our Mobile Soup Kitchen looking for meals.

In the weeks and months ahead you may hear from a variety of groups asking for your support. These groups may be national or state wide in scope, funded heavily and primarily through federal, state and county dollars and are often required to financially support their parent organization in another part of the country. They usually have very polished and well-funded public relations programs that flood our mail boxes and messengers throughout the year. This newsletter is as polished as SHIP will get!

SHIP is glad to be known as the agency of last resort. It is not uncommon for many ministers, church secretaries, lawyers, agency directors and workers in this area to send people to SHIP if there is nowhere else to get help for the person. If SHIP has the resources available, SHIP helps anyone in need. <u>Please recognize that</u> <u>YOU ARE SHIP!</u> If you provide the resources we can help - but if we do not have resources, where will the homeless and hungry go?

Those of us at SHIP believe that the decision concerning which charitable organizations to support must be made by the individual faith community and personal donors in the community. However please remember that SHIP is a face to face, low overhead provider, operated by a formerly homeless person and is often the provider of last resort to the homeless and hungry in our region. In <u>God's name we pray that you please continue or start</u> <u>your support of our programs.</u>

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Service (1) pull-top cans of meats, meals, etc. (for drop-in clients) OR

Collect cans of Beef-a-Roni, beans, etc. for the soup kitchen ((2) #10 size or 18 small per meal) OR Make a casserole with your troop. Nothing fancy - mac n' cheese, franks and beans, sliced ham is fine or whatever your specialty. SHIP requests that we supply (2) 1/2 tray sizes of the same meal as opposed to one full (turkey sized) aluminum tray size.

- Service (2): Hygiene Kits: Make up individual small hygiene bags (3-day supply) with a toothbrush, toothpaste, shampoo, bar soap, deodorant, etc.
- Service (3): Decorations for Special Events: Make placemats, table decorations, and seasonal decorations: SHIP's Holiday Meals – Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day and Easter Sunday and client Christmas Gift Distributions to Families and single adults with no children.
- Service (4): Clothing: Collect winter gloves, new socks & underwear (adult men's sizes) OR run adult coat drive. (While SHIP does not have the facilities for large scale sorting of used clothing, some winter coats are needed at this time of year, especially adult men's sizes.)
- Service (5): Participate in SHIP's Holiday Meal Programs: Help serve meals & other duties (held on Easter, Thanksgiving and Christmas).
- Service (6): Run a Holiday Toy Drive for our children, women and men in need.
- Service (7): Assist with SHIP's Annual Night of Celebration: set up; greet guests and honorees and other chores) Each year, date TBD.
- Service (8): Help with Client's Christmas Gift Distributions in December will be a children only party with face painting, games, toys, treats (make cookies, cupcakes, other Christmas treats), etc. for approx. 200 children
- Service (9): Help with SHIP's Mobile Soup Kitchen Disaster Unit (must be 16 ½ years old.) see website for additional information. SHIP908.com

Service (10): Help with summer picnics at our Tick Tock's Grove during the months of June, July and August.

- Service (11): SHIP's Brown Bag Lunches: Make sandwiches (60) in brown bags, labeled appropriately: Ham & Cheese (HC), Bologna (B) Tuna (TF) Turkey (TF) American Cheese (C) Peanut Butter & Jelly (PJ). Also include: one piece of fruit, juice box, snack (chips, cookies etc.) and napkin per bag. NO MUSTARD, BUTTER or OTHER DRESSING.
